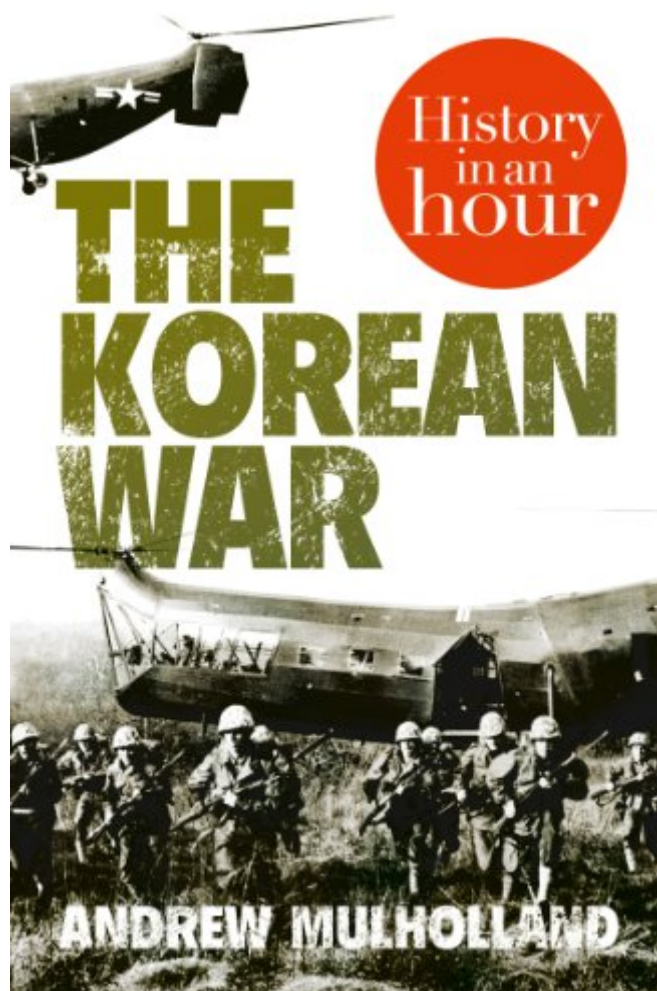


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The Korean War: History In An Hour

It was my war but I served here in the USA. This filled in the gaps which I did not know about. I did serve with a combat veteran who went from the Yalu river to the 38th during the Chinese offensive.

This war happened over 60 years ago and it's good to get a refresher on how it all started and why, especially when we have loved ones that were involved.
